Club Boat trip Pladda 4th October

With a deep fast moving depression traversing Scotland on Saturday, It seemed unlikely that this trip would go ahead, however, skipper Tony had faith in the weather forecasts and despite the gale peaking at force 10 on Saturday afternoon the 10 club members meeting at Girvan Harbour on Sunday morning were met by a bright day with a mild breeze and a sea with a moderate but decreasing chop from the gale.

Following a slightly bumpy ride to the West of Pladda the fishing started with a few drifts for mackerel, soon there were enough on board and a short move was made to the reef for Pollack fishing.

There was some concern that the previous day's conditions may have dispersed the fish and put them down, but taking three fish on my first four casts, the best at 5lb, made me rethink this forecast, obviously a mistake as I couldn't get a bite for the next hour and a half.

Others were having no trouble finding fish, however, with Peter and Stewart particularly boating a steady stream of Pollack and most people getting enough fish to keep their attention.

By the time Tony called the final lines up we had enjoyed a steady if unspectacular day's fishing having taken over 100 fish between us, catching mainly Pollack with a few Coalies, Ballans and Cuckoo Wrasse and a lone LSD to Ken. Peter had won the day and also taken the largest fish, a Pollack of 6lb. Stewart was second and I was third. The weather had also been kind to us with the breeze dying out and a virtually calm sea for the run back to Girvan.

SILVER LURE CHOCLATE CHALLENGE RULES.

As we have now entered a new fishing year, I thought I might remind members of our rules for the "choccy challenge", which is totally voluntary and just a bit of fun on the day.

1. The competition to be called "The Silver Lure Chocolate Challenge".
2. Any Club Member participating at a Club Outing may take part.
3. The entry fee at each outing shall be one standard size bar of chocolate (although a bigger bar may be contributed at the entrants discretion - if he's daft), the variety to be of each individuals choosing.
4. The winner of the sweep shall be participant who weighs in the highest taking size fish, other than a lesser spotted dogfish, at each match. In the event of no species other than lesser spotted dogfish being captured, or no fish being returned to the scales at a match, the pool shall "roll over" to the next match. The participants will agree on one of their number, (other than Big Booby as he is back of his diet), to hold the pool.
5. In the event of the pool holder neglecting to bring the pool to the subsequent match, (eating it) he will have to replace it with double the quantity.
6. Anyone not in possession of a chocolate bar prior to the outing will not be eligible to participate at that outing.
7. Any participant found to be taking the competition seriously will be disqualified. (Bish, that means no size 18 hooks.)

As you'll have gathered from the above rules, it's just a bit of extra fun that provides a focus for some banter, please pay special attention to rule 7. [
